### **Artificial Intelligence in the Writing Centre: Transformation, Adaptations, and Future Perspectives**

The *Journal für Schreibwissenschaft - JoSch* invites authors to contribute to a special issue focusing on the profound transformation of academic writing due to the advances in artificial intelligence (AI). The main aim of this issue is to explore the impact of AI on everyday practice in writing centers and programs, rather than looking at the general impact of AI on academic writing.

We welcome contributions of recent research findings, experience reports, and theoretical considerations in the following areas (though not limited to):

#### **Transformation of writing pedagogy**

- How can AI reshape the practices and methods in writing centres (e.g., teaching formats and course design, peer tutoring, writing fellow programs)?
- How does AI shape writing in the disciplines, e.g., in the humanities, creative, or STEM disciplines?
- What new roles might emerge for writing centre professionals?
- How can AI effectively be integrated into writing tutoring?

#### **Ethical Considerations**

- How can ethical challenges posed by AI in writing instruction be addressed?
- How can equitable access to AI-enhanced writing instruction be ensured?

#### **Skill Adaptation for Writing Centre Professionals and Peer Tutors**

- What new skills are necessary to adapt to AI advancements?
- How can the training of peer tutors be modified to equip them for integrating AI?

#### **Furthermore**

- Changes in student writing
- Impact of AI on the development of students' writing skills
- Transformation of writing strategies through the use of AI

Overall, we address the issue of how artificial intelligence can influence our identity and value as professionals at academic writing centres.

- Final Check: 22 May–28 May 2024
